


### DOES YOUR CHILD OR TEENAGER HAVE SLEEP DIFFICULTIES?




### LADYBIRDS

Ladybirds have had a lovely book week. We have spent lots of time reading for pleasure, as a class and as a whole school which we have really enjoyed. We worked with the Dragonflies to research different authors and create information posters on them. We had a PE lesson on tag rugby which we were very good at and we have also spent some time looking at Diwali and the festival of light.

### **DRAGONFLIES**

Dragonflies have been reading, reading, reading this week! The children started Book Week by reading around school, mixing with other year groups in their 'houses'. We wrote acrostic poems about hoping for something linked to our book of the week 'A Flicker of Hope' by Julia Cook. We really enjoyed reading all the Oil series of books this week and we came up with some very imaginative ideas about what we could sit on when we created our own version of an Oi! book. For Book Week we have spent time in each of the classrooms sharing a storytime with the teachers and then completed tasks based round that story. Dragonflies and Ladybirds worked together for a morning to create author profiles (choosing either Julia Donaldson, Kes Gray or Jaqueline Wilson). The children researched everything they could about their author and presented their findings in a way of their choice. In Maths we have looked at word problems: identifying the relevant information in a sentence and working out what the number sentence would be.



# What Parents & Carers Need to Know about **[P**)

Microtransactions (often abbreviated as "MTX") are digital purchases made within an app or game to unlock extra features or additional content such as new levels. A popular sub-set of these are loot boxes, which contain a selection (usually, random) of virtual items: from character skins to game-changing equipment like better weapons. Microtransactions (and loot boxes) in particular) are now widespread in apps and games, but concerns persist that they normalise gambling and can foster addictive behaviours – especially among younger players.


