know the difference between this and a friendship fallout. This policy has been created to support children in their understanding of this very important area, and to help them know what to do if they are sad or need some help.



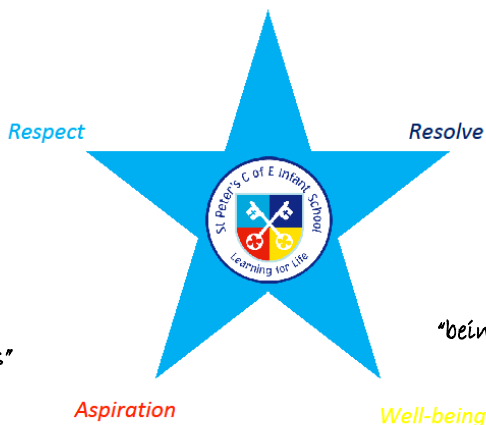
As a school, we have four core values which reflect our ethos:

What is bullying?

Several Times On Purpose

Bullying is behaviour that is **repetitive**, so it happens over and over again. This can be in person or via social media.

What is a friendship fallout?

A friendship fallout is when you have a fallout with a friend, maybe in the playground when playing a game, but the difference is that you will make up and are friends again soon afterwards.

What should you do if you think you are being bullied?



TELL A GROWN UP STRAIGHT AWAY THEY ARE HERE TO HELP YOU

IF SOMEONE IS NOT VERY KIND TO US:-

We must find a teacher to speak to straight away. They will support and comfort us. The teachers will work with the child who made the wrong choice and ask them to say sorry or write a note. We may need to think about how we deal with our anger and a teacher will help us with this.

IF WE MAKE THE WRONG CHOICE:-

BE BRAVE AND TELL THE TRUTH, WE KNOW THIS IS HARD BUT THE TEACHERS WILL BE PROUD OF YOU FOR YOUR HONESTY.

A teacher will support you to be reflective and think about your actions. You may have to write a social story with Miss Greenaway or one of the teachers to look at different outcomes to the situation. How could I have acted better?

Here is a flow chart to show you what to do if you feel you have been bullied.



A bullying incident occurs to you



You tell a teacher straight away

The teacher will give their support , listening carefully to all you tell them.



The teacher will speak straight away to the child who has been bullying. They will work with the pupil to help them reflect on their behaviour and how they can put things right. The teacher will guide the pupil in the days and weeks ahead



The teacher will speak to the child who has been bullied and support them carefully in the days and weeks ahead



Miss Greenaway will speak to both of the children's parents so that they can also support their children



All the adults at school will closely monitor the children involved to make sure they are feeling safe and happy.

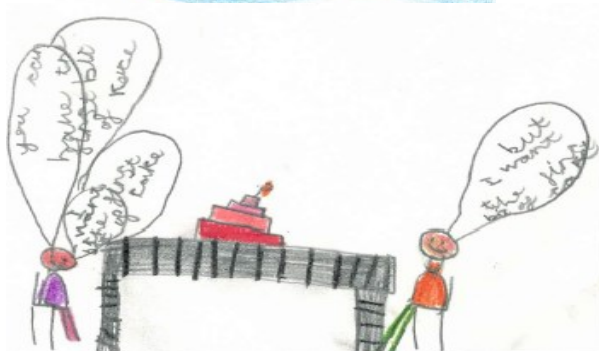
Anti-bullying buddies will also support you at breaktimes and lunchtimes.

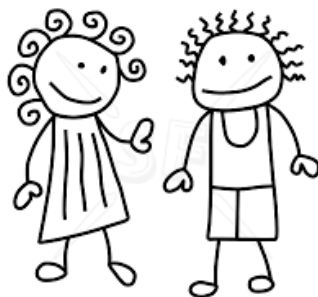
