The children have come back totally refreshed and we have already marvelled at the way they are settling to their work and exciting new topics. It is fantastic to hear their comments and see how their enthusiasm for learning has grown, as indeed they all seem to have done over the holiday!

The Ladybirds have been writing their own Peter Rabbit stories (personally, one of my favourite childhood books) while the Dragonflies have been doing the most fantastic research into some of the passengers who were on the RMS Titanic that sank in 1912. The story allowed them to have an understanding of what it might be like to be hearing impaired and they were able to both see and do some sign language.



# CLASS NEWS

## BUSY BEES



This week Busy Bees have been learning all about Transport and finding out lots of facts about those amazing machines. We looked at information books about transport and wrote lists of our favourite ones. In Maths we learned how to use the ten frame to count to 10 and explored the composition of numbers 9 and 10. During our RE lesson we have started to explore some of Jesus stories. This week we thought about "How Jesus rescued people who needed food".

## LADYBIRDS

Ladybirds have had a brilliant week. We have started our 'animals including humans' topic, by looking at and labelling the parts of the human body. We started learning all about Florence Nightingale in History. We have learned about what she did and how she made hospitals better. In Maths we have been learning that 2 digit numbers are made from tens and some ones. In English we have continued looking at Peter Rabbit and we have written our own versions of the story. We also designed and made Mr McGregor's vegetable garden out of junk modelling materials.



## DRAGONFLIES

Dragonflies have had a very historical week. We have started our new topic based around Titanic. The children have found out what the ship was, where it was going and discovered information about some of the people who were on board. The facts they have already retained is impressive! In English we have begun our work around the film "Up". We watched a small clip from the film and used this to create character descriptions. We introduced the concept of similes to this, which they picked up quickly. In Maths we have looked at finding fractions of amounts and shapes. In Science the children looked around the school to find examples of plastic—this is part of our materials topic.
