This may involve teachers using a range of strategies, detailed in the Surrey 'Ordinarily Available Provision' (OAP) toolkit to support learners to access and engage with the curriculum. The toolkit can also be used to facilitate conversation between learners, parents, and educational settings. The toolkit references reasonable adjustments which can be understood as the requirement for a school to take positive steps to ensure that all pupils can fully participate in the education provided by the school, and that they can enjoy the other benefits, facilities, and services that the school provides for pupils.</i></p>	Regular Readers.
