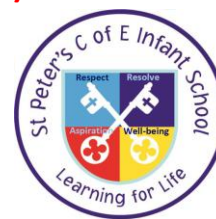

The School commitments

We shall endeavour to:

- Provide a safe, supportive and nurturing environment where all children are valued, respected and listened to.

- Monitor and communicate with parents and carers regularly on your child's progress.

- Respect the confidentiality of information regarding each child.
- Provide information to you about our school, including relevant policies, meetings, workshops and events by keeping our website up to date, emailing regular bulletins and updating an annual calendar of events at regular intervals.
- Offer your child opportunities to develop a sense of responsibility, form healthy social relationships and build their self-esteem
- Set homework that supports the delivery of the curriculum and mark it where appropriate.
- Offer opportunities for parents and carers to get involved in school life.
- Respond to communications from parents in a timely manner, following school policies.
- Encourage good attendance and address any concerns with parents or carers where necessary.

Parents / Carers commitments

We shall endeavour to:

- provide support to staff and governors in the running of the school
- see that our children arrive and are collected from school punctually
- report absences to the school office by 9am on the first day and every subsequent day
- support the school's attendance policy and take family holidays only out of school time
- let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect schoolwork or behaviour
- respect school regulations and support decisions and advice that are given
- in the case of complaint, agree to use the school's established procedures
- teach our children acceptable standards of behaviour and respect towards others and their surroundings
- show an interest in our children's life at school
- ensure our children are well rested and therefore ready to learn
- support our children in home reading and other opportunities for home learning
- attend parents' evenings and discussions about progress
- ensure our children travel between home and school safely
- park responsibly and with consideration for others
- close all gates to ensure the safety of all children
