CLASS NEWS

BUSY BEES

Busy Bees children have been exploring the exciting world of punctuation! After reading the delightful story "Dear Dinosaur" by Chae Strathie, they learned all about question marks and had a go at writing their own questions inspired by the book. In Maths, we have been busy building our number skills by practising "one more" and "one less" up to 20. The children have been using this knowledge to begin learning how to add and subtract with confidence. We also put this into practice by playing "The Bus Stop" game on the School field. We got creative in our art sessions, making some beautiful pieces for our upcoming Busy Bees Tea Time on Monday after school. We can't wait to share our artwork with you!

Homework: Read 5 minutes per day and if you have a line for our Collective Worship please practice it over the weekend.





LADYBIRDS

Ladybirds used the fairy tale 'The Three Little Pigs' to inspire their writing this week. They planned and created their own version of the story by changing some of the characters, for example 'The Three Fish and the Big Bad Shark'. We also conducted an experiment in which we built a 'house' of straw, carefully considering how we could make it strong. We tested our designs when the big, bad wolf came to try to blow our houses down. And we were very pleased that he didn't manage it! In Maths we have been re capping time to o'clock and half past the hour. We have remembered this skill well. In Science we have been sorting materials into various groups according to their individual properties.

DRAGONFLIES

The children have been working incredibly hard in their English this week, exploring the 'Tinga Tinga Tales'. (a series of animated children's African folk tales.) The children watched 'The Lion's Roar' before taking the components of the story to write their own version; to accompany our work in Geography on the Masia Mara. They used a thesaurus to broaden their word choices and extend their great writing, which they love doing! The stories were fantastic, and the children took great delight in reading them to the rest of the class. The class have also started their rehearses for their final End of Year Leaver's play. They are making us so proud with their commitment and hard work.

Homework: Learn your lines and practice the song words as much as possible—it really does make a difference rehearsing without scripts.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

As its name suggests, YouTube Kids is a child-friendly version of Google's online video-sharing platform. Its colourful user interface is designed with young people in mind, and it offers a curated, family-friendly experience with features like age-based content settings and parental controls.



INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT BYPASSING FILTERS 18

YouTube Kids is less likely to show inappropriate material than YouTube, but there have been reports of the app showing age-inappropriate content to young viewers. One investigation found that YouTube Kids had shown videos that promote skin bleaching, weight loss, drug culture and firearms to children as young as they as inappropriate.



Advice for Parents & Educators

PARENTAL CONTROLS

YouTube Kids offers several settings that allow you to manage what content children can view. For example, you can choose what level of content you want them to access, such as 'Preschool' or 'Younger'. You can also turn off the search function, so that only those videos approved by the YouTube Kids team themselves will appear on a child's recommendations list.

CHECK WATCH HISTORY

YouTube Kids has made it easy for you to keep an eye on what the children in your care have been watching on the app. By clicking on the 'Recommended' loon at the top right of the home screen, you can see which videos they've been viewing, and how much of each. If a child watches YouTube Kids while signed into a Google account, you can check their history through Google's 'My Activity' page.

SET TIME LIMITS

The built-in parental controls let you keep a tab on how long children spend watching videos. You can set a timer that limits screen time and disables the YouTube Kids app once a specified length of time has been reached. It's also worth speaking to children about the dangers of spending to o much time on YouTube, to ensure they remain focused on other, more important activities.

WATCH TOGETHER

It's important that you try to make YouTube Kids a fun and positive experience for children. One way to do this is by introducing watching sessions, where you all gather around and share the most enjoyable videos that you have recently watched. This can be a great way of giving you both new things to talk about and of keeping an eye on what they're watching.
